



# Employment Collection Notice

Mater Dei collects personal information, including sensitive information about job applicants. This includes information provided in your job application, in the course of conversation or as collected from third parties on your behalf, such as employment referees. The primary purpose of collecting this information is to enable Mater Dei to consider your application for employment with the Organisation.

2. Some of the information Mater Dei collects is to satisfy the Organisation's legal obligations, particularly to enable it to discharge its duty of care to enrolled students/participants.

3. Laws governing or relating to the operation of a school/service provider require certain information to be collected and disclosed. These include relevant Education Acts and Public Health and Child Protection laws.

4. In order to consider your application for employment and to facilitate and manage your employment relationship with Mater Dei, you consent to our collecting personal information about you from recruitment agencies, law enforcement agencies for criminal checks and working with children checks, educational institutions to verify your qualifications, and other individuals or businesses we contact for the purpose of reference-checking as agreed with you.

5. The personal information that is collected about you will be stored securely in a recruitment record. If you are successful and become an employee then an employee record will be created and the personal information we have collected will be stored in this file. Employee records are exempt from the Australian Privacy Principles (APPs) under the Privacy Act 1988.

6. If you are not offered a position or if you decline an offer of a position at Mater Dei the information stored in your recruitment record will be stored for 12 months, unless you advise us to destroy the records at an earlier time. At this time, Mater Dei will take reasonable steps to destroy or de-identify the information as appropriate.

7. Mater Dei may disclose personal and sensitive information for administrative, educational and support purposes (or may permit the information to be directly collected by third parties). This may include to:

- government departments;
- people providing administrative and financial services to the Organisation;
- anyone you authorise the Organisation to disclose information to; and

- anyone to whom Mater Dei is required or authorised to disclose the information to by law, including under child protection laws.

8. Failure to provide the information to Mater Dei will affect the Mater Dei's ability to evaluate your application and may result in the recruitment process not proceeding.

9. Mater Dei may also use cloud computing service providers to store personal information (which may include sensitive information) on their servers in the 'cloud'. These servers may be located in or outside Australia. This may mean that personal information may be stored or processed outside Australia.

11. Mater Dei's Privacy Policy contains further information about its use of cloud and other third-party service providers and any of their overseas locations.

12. Mater Dei's Privacy Policy is accessible via its website. The Policy sets out how job applicants and employees may seek access to, and correction of their personal information which Mater Dei has collected and holds. However, access may be refused in certain circumstances such as where access would have an unreasonable impact on the privacy of others, or may result in a breach of the Organisation's duty of care obligations. Any refusal will be notified in writing with reasons if appropriate.

13. Mater Dei's Privacy Policy also sets out how job applicants and employees can make a complaint about a breach of the APPs and how the complaint will be handled.

15. If you provide Mater Dei with the personal information of others, such as other employment referees, doctors or emergency contacts, we encourage you to inform them you are disclosing that information to Mater Dei and why, that they can request access to and correction of that information if they wish and to also refer them to Mater Dei's Privacy Policy for further detail about such requests and how the Mater Dei otherwise handles personal information it collects and complaints it receives.
